Local Councillor Elections

Four parish councillors were elected and took their seats at the Annual PC meeting on May 15th 2023 – Cllr. Bryan Mander (Chair), Cllr. James Roberts (Vice-Chair), Cllr. Margaret Foster and Cllr. Michelle Sheppard. Chris Black had decided not to stand for re-election and councillors expressed their thanks for the long service and support that he had given as a councillor and previously as Chair. This means there are three vacancies to be filled – could you be the right person to get involved and make a difference? Please get in touch with the clerk to find out more about the role and how to apply.

The Annual PC meeting always has a full agenda due to the many administrative and governance documents that must be reviewed, together with the approval of its accounting and audit records. As in previous years, the internal auditor commented on the robust systems in place for the management and administration of the council's affairs – which of course, the council will continue to maintain allowing it to fund and support projects and good causes in the community.

Update on SID - Our Speed Indicator Device

We all know that excess speed is a major factor in road traffic collisions. The purpose of a SID is not to photograph or record number plates but to monitor driver behaviour and use that information to identify measures that might be needed to reinforce road safety. Our SID counted a total of 26337 vehicles on Bunkers Hill from Feb-May 2023, with a seven-day average daily movement of 268 vehicles, peaking at 8.00 am and 16:00, travelling at an *average* 26.51 mph. Figures also reveal that 85% of monitored vehicles were travelling at 31.7 mph in a 30 mph area - but most shockingly a speed of 54 mph was captured at 14:15 on 31 May 2023 – nearly twice the legal speed limit! So if you have concerns about speeding in the village, please be aware that data captured by the SID would need supporting details such as vehicle make/model/registration to bring it to the attention of the authorities, which only residents would be able to provide. But hopefully, the presence of SID serves as a reminder to all drivers about their speed and helps change driving habits for the better.



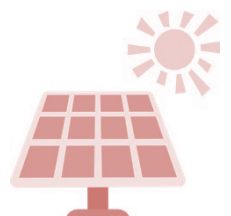
Hemswell and Harpswell 'Memory Books' Meeting - Tuesday 25th July at 7.00 pm

Tillbridge Solar Limited Public Consultation on 6th July - your chance to get involved

You will most likely have seen the marketing campaigns and corresponding public concern regarding the planned solar and energy storage schemes in our neighbouring areas. Because the Tillbridge Solar Ltd. scheme is so large, with plans to generate over 50MW, it is legally required to carry out public consultations and the Tillbridge Solar project team will be at Hemswell & Harpswell Village Hall on *Thursday 6th July from 2:30 – 6:30 pm*.



**Looking ahead
– Rejuvenating
the Pinfold**

The Parish Council has declared itself an ‘interested party’ with concerns over the density of the developments and loss or impact upon agricultural land and aligns with the statements expressed by the 7000 Acres Group (see website: <https://www.7000acres.co.uk/>). No doubt there is much discussion and debate to come from these planned developments, and the Parish Council will discuss and report any issues that may impact the community via its bimonthly meetings.

Rejuvenating the ‘Pinfold’

In the first newsletter, we wrote that the PC is keen to ‘rejuvenate’ the pinfold on Brook Street. The pinfold (meaning a ‘pound’ or ‘fold/pen’ for stray sheep or cattle found grazing on land without permission) is recorded as Monument record MLI50994 on the Lincolnshire Heritage Explorer website. Once in the pinfold, a Pinder (usually appointed by the Manor Court) was responsible for rounding up, guarding, and caring for the animals until their owner paid a fine to reclaim them. It is thought that the Hemswell Pinfold dates to 1808 or earlier.
