West Lindsey Open Churches 2025

A100 churches are to take part in this year's annual festival held over two weekends in May and 15 straddle outside West Lindsey's border. The demand for the brochure has been great this year .Churches taking part in the Henmswell ward are as follows; Corringham, Glentworth Hemswell, [new this year] Heapham, and Grayingham.The festival is a flag ship of WLD first established 28 years ago and still going strong thanks to the volunteers who put in a lot of time and work which is greatly appreciated.



The Government could make a decision to sell RAF Scampton to West Lindsey District Council soon, the authority's leader has said. The former RAF base has been stuck in limbo for months after plans to use it as housing for asylum seekers were abandoned.

The council hopes to regenerate it as a centre for aviation and tourism, which it says would create hundreds of jobs and bring £300 million of investment to the area. West Lindsey leaders met with government minister Angela Eagle last week to lobby the case for them buying it, rather than it being put on the open market.

Council leader Councillor Trevor Young (Lib Dem) said at a meeting on Monday (March 3) that he is hopeful a positive announcement would come very soon.

"We had a very productive meeting and I'm very optimistic the government will make announcement shortly decision to transfer site to us," he said. "I believe will finally get it over the line."

Baltic Mill

The former Baltic Mill site is being transformed into additional green space for our residents to enjoy.

West Lindsey District Council have teamed up with <u>Savoy</u> <u>Cinemas</u>- Opens in a new window to deliver a 4-screen cinema, two retail units and a restaurant, as well as additional parking. Local construction company the Gelder Group have secured the contract to build the state-of-the-art complex in the Market Place.

It is funded through contributions from the Council, the Greater Lincolnshire Local Enterprise Partnership (GLLEP), the governments Levelling Up Fund and Savoy Cinemas.

The scheme will be completed by June 2025.



The contract was delivered by and the construction phase is expected to run until April 2025. The park will be open to the public in Summer 2025, once the lawns and plants are established. Whittons Gardens along the bank of the River Trent has undergone a refurbishment which is to include toilets and a café The Opening Ceremony Friday 16 of May @1pm by the Chairman of WLDC
